

Local Projects Requested by Senator Peters Included in the Government Funding Bill

Water Infrastructure Investments

8 ½ Mile Drain Drainage District In-System Storage

Recipient: 8 ½ Mile Drain Drainage District

Project Location: Macomb County

Funding Received: \$4,500,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to maximize the use of existing infrastructure by constructing In-System Storage devices to increase sewer storage capacity, which will improve the water quality of Lake St. Clair and help alleviate the possibility of residential basement flooding during heavy rain events.

City of St. Clair Water Treatment Plant Improvements

Recipient: City of St. Clair

Project Location: St. Clair

Funding Received: \$970,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to upgrade the performance and reliability of the St. Clair Water Treatment Plant (WTP), while also assisting it in complying with regulatory standards.

Clay-Ira Interceptor Project

Recipient: Clay Township

Project Location: Clay Township

Funding Received: \$1,000,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to rehabilitate the interceptor sewer for Clay Township and Ira Township, restoring the service life of aging infrastructure pipelines and protecting the users and natural environment from catastrophic failures or the unexpected discharge of untreated wastewater directly into sensitive environmental areas.

Great Lakes Water Authority Detroit River Interceptor Evaluation and Rehabilitation

Recipient: Great Lakes Water Authority

Project Location: Detroit

Funding Received: \$2,000,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to evaluate and rehabilitate the Detroit River Interceptor (DRI), which is a critical piece of infrastructure to the Great Lakes Water Authority's (GLWA) system. The project will result in a more reliable DRI capable of conveying capacity flows to GLWA's water and will also address major blockages in the DRI caused by debris and other large objects that become lodged in the interceptor, which reduce its capacity and make the system more vulnerable to causing negative public health and environmental impacts.

Martin Drain In-System Storage Device

Recipient: Martin Sanitary Diversion Drainage District

Project Location: Clinton

Funding Received: \$1,000,000

Project Description: This funding will be used reduce combined sewage overflows (CSO) to the Martin Retention Basin, which services the sewage needs for the cities of Roseville and St. Clair Shores and whose excess flows are discharged to Lake St. Clair, by installing an In-System Storage Device that will reduce CSO volume by 20 percent annually.

Menominee River Deepening, Michigan and Wisconsin

Project Description: This funding will be used by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to conduct a feasibility study, or general investigation, into potential harbor infrastructure improvements in the Menominee-Marquette Harbor to improve utilization of Great Lakes waterways as a more sustainable transportation mode, improve congestion and air quality on surface roads, and increase economic opportunity and jobs in Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

Shelby Water Reservoir – 3.5 Million Gallon

Recipient: Charter Township of Shelby

Project Location: Shelby

Funding Received: \$1,000,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to support the Charter Township of Shelby's Water Reservoir project, which is a 3.5-million-gallon facility that will be designed to equalize water demands, reduce pressure fluctuations in the distribution system, and to manage and reduce rates to users of the system.

Tuscarora Township Septic to Sewer Expansion and Modernization Project – Protecting Our Community and the Great Lakes

Funding Received: \$3,500,000

Project Description: This funding will be used to replace aging, problematic, noncompliant or nonexistent septic systems within an environmentally sensitive area in Tuscarora Township that is zoned for lake and stream protection. The project will address local, regional, national and international concerns for Great Lakes protection while improving public health and protecting the tourist-based economy.
