Named in honor of a veteran who died because of toxic exposure during his time in military service, the *Sergeant First Class (SFC) Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act* is historic legislation that U.S. Senator Gary Peters helped pass into law that will **deliver all generations of toxic-exposed veterans their long-overdue VA health care and benefits.**

Expands VA Health Care Eligibility

- Expands toxic-exposed veterans' access to VA health care
- Extends the period of health care enhanced eligibility for Post-9/11 combat veterans

Improves VA's Presumption Process

 Creates a framework for the establishment of future toxic exposurerelated presumptions of service connection

Bolsters VA's Toxic Exposure Resources

- Provides every veteran a toxic exposure screening at VA medical appointments
- **Increases** toxic exposure-related education and training for VA health care and benefits personnel

Strengthens Toxic Exposure Research Includes studies on mortality of veterans who served in Southwest Asia during the Gulf War, Post-9/11 veterans' health trends, and veterans' cancer rates
